## **SECTION 4 : FIRST AID MEASURES**

#### 4.1. description of first aid measures

### In the event of exposure by inhalation:

In the event of massive inhalation of dust, remove the person exposed to fresh air. Keep warm and at rest.

In the event of an allergic reaction, seek medical attention.

If the contaminated aera is widespread and/or there is damage to the skin, a doctor must be consulted or the patient transferred to hospital.

### In the event of swallowing:
